Information for the Public

The meetings of the full Council, comprising all 60 members of South Somerset District Council, are held at least 6 times a year. The full Council approves the Council's budget and the major policies which comprise the Council's policy framework. Other decisions which the full Council has to take include appointing the Leader of the Council, members of the District Executive, other Council Committees and approving the Council's Constitution (which details how the Council works including the scheme allocating decisions and Council functions to committees and officers).

Members of the Public are able to:-

- attend meetings of the Council and its committees such as Area Committees, District Executive, except where, for example, personal or confidential matters are being discussed;
- speak at Area Committees, District Executive and Council meetings;
- see reports and background papers, and any record of decisions made by the Council and Executive;
- find out, from the Executive Forward Plan, what major decisions are to be decided by the District Executive.

Meetings of the Council are scheduled to be held monthly at 6.30 p.m. on the third Thursday of the month (unless advised otherwise). However during the coronavirus pandemic these meetings will be held remotely via Zoom video-conferencing. For more details on the regulations regarding remote/virtual meetings please see the Local Authorities and Police and Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 as part of the Coronavirus Act 2020.

Purpose of the Report

1. To confirm amendments to the Scrutiny Committee membership following the appointment of Councillors to various committees and working groups at Council on 21st May 2019.

Public Interest

2. The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 came into force on 4th April 2020.

Regulation 4 states:-

Meetings of local authorities

4.—(1) In respect of a reference in any enactment to a meeting of a local authority, that authority may, as they may determine—

- (a) hold such meetings and at such hour and on such days; and
- (b) alter the frequency, move or cancel such meetings, without requirement for further notice.
- (2) Where an appointment would otherwise be made or require to be made at an annual meeting of a local authority, such appointment continues until the next annual meeting of the authority or until such time as that authority may determine.
- 3. This allows appointments normally made at an annual meeting to be continued until the next annual meeting or until such time as the authority determines. Councils therefore have the option to hold annual meetings remotely or in person when the restrictions are lifted or to go through to the next meeting in 2021.
- 4. For the continued safety of Councillors and staff, it was agreed to postpone the SSDC Annual Council meeting until such time as it is safe to call a meeting in person again. However due to two resignations and some changes in political party, there is a need to appoint new members to this Committee.



- 5. In accordance with Section 16 (1) Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the duty therein to give effect to the wishes of the political group to which seats on any committee are allocated, the Council confirm that:
 - a) Councillors Louise Clark and Oliver Patrick be appointed to the Scrutiny Committee
 - b) Councillor Linda Vijeh be appointed to the Scrutiny Committee

Background

6. Each year at their annual meeting, Council agree to appoint Councillors to the various committees and to represent SSDC on outside organisations. This report confirms the wishes of the Liberal Democrat and Conservative groups to make amendments to the Councillors appointed to the Scrutiny Committee.

Report Detail

7. The membership of committees and working groups for 2019/20 was approved at the Annual Council meeting on 21st May 2019. Since then Councillors Mike Stanton and Rob Stickland have indicated that they wish to step down from the Scrutiny Committee and there have also been some changes in political party. The Scrutiny Committee is in political balance and the current political composition is 9 Lib Dem, 4 Cons and 1 Independent Member. Members are asked to confirm the appointment of three new Councillors to the Committee.

The following Motion was submitted by Councillor Oliver Patrick:

Motion to support DEFRA's ambition to phase out the badger cull in England

Council stands with our farmers who face the ever-present threat of their herd receiving a positive diagnosis of bovine tuberculosis (bTB). Council believes that our hard-working farmers and rural communities deserve effective, long-term solutions to this disease which is one of the UK's greatest animal health threats.

In 2018, the Environment Secretary commissioned the Godfray Review¹. This review analysed England's cull data and all available scientific evidence, concluding that the Department for the Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (DEFRA) should consider alternatives to the current policy of large and repeated badger culls.

In March 2020, DEFRA responded to the Godfray Review by publishing a policy paper: *Next steps for the strategy for achieving bovine tuberculosis free status for England*. ² In the foreword, Secretary of State George Eustice MP stated that the government will pursue an exit strategy from the intensive culling of badgers, with a view to phasing it out by the mid to late 2020s.³ These proposals focus on longer-term solutions to the problem of bTB such as improving farm biosecurity, strengthening cattle testing and movement controls, increasing badger vaccination programmes, and continuing to develop an effective bTB vaccine for cattle.

However, despite DEFRA's ambition to phase out the cull, Natural England issued a new 4-year licence for Somerset in September 2020. There are now 5 known cull licences in operation across Somerset:

- 1. Area 17 licence: expires January 20214
- 2. Area 18 licence: expires January 20215
- 3. Area 30 licence: expires January 20226
- 4. Area 2 supplementary licence: expiry unknown7
- 5. NEW Area 51 licence: expires 20248

Proposal:

That Council resolves to ask the Chief Executive / relevant officer to:

- i. Write to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs to:
 - inform him of our support for DEFRA's ambition to phase out the badger cull, and that we are opposed to repeated badger culling in Somerset
 - offer access to Council land as part of a coordinated badger-vaccination programme
- ii. Continue to refuse permission to cull badgers on SSDC land, and to write to all Parish Councils in South Somerset to encourage them to do the same;
- iii. Engage at the appropriate level with other councils across Somerset to ascertain what steps, if any, that our partners in local government are taking in relation to the issue of bTB;
- iv. Publicise Council's resolution to support DEFRA's ambition to phase out the cull;
- v. Provide councillors with an update regarding all of the above at least prior to the next badger cull due to commence in autumn 2021.

Motions (2)

The following Motion was submitted by Councillor Mike Hewitson:

Opposing the Government's ill thought-through proposals for Planning

Council notes the publication of the hastily put together Government Consultation: Planning for the Future.

These proposals will deprive communities across South Somerset of their already limited ability to have their say on contentious planning matters. This is anti-democratic and unworthy of even this Government.

With 9 out of 10 Planning Applications already receiving approval, this White Paper will not address the principal obstruction to building more houses: the failure of developers to build out their approvals.

The Government's own assessment is that these proposals could lead to a 20% reduction in the delivery of affordable homes. This will make it more difficult for our essential keyworkers to put down roots in our communities, and nullifies the tremendous efforts they have made during the Coronavirus Crisis.

The 'temporary' increase in the threshold for Affordable Housing for small sites, from 10 up to 50 homes, will mean that rural communities in South Somerset could be overwhelmed as developers race to beat this deadline.

The environmental proposals are at odds with the Government's and our recognition of a Climate and Ecological Emergency and jeopardises our rich habitats and biodiversity by using greenfield sites and watering down impact assessments. This is not progress. This will spoil lovely South Somerset.

Proposal:

Council therefore resolves to:

- 1. write to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government and to our local MPs to express concern over these proposals;
- 2. reflect the strength of concern across the Authority in its official consultation response;
- 3. highlight South Somerset District Council's concerns over these proposals with the public at every suitable opportunity;
- 4. provide Councillors with an update on the progress of these proposals at regular intervals;



- 5. work with partner organisations such as social housing providers to understand the impact of these proposals on the delivery of affordable housing in South Somerset;
- 6. work with partner organisations such as Somerset Wildlife Trust to understand the impact of these proposals on our biodiversity and habitats.

Background Information

Planning for the Future proposes to:

- Reduce the input of local communities in planning decisions by limiting this to the Plan Making Stage.
- Promote the densification of existing settlements.
- Make environmental impact assessments "quicker and simpler".
- Create a "one-size fits all" approach to planning policy, removing flexibility from Local Authorities to write their own planning policies.
- Remove from Local Authorities the ability to seek local agreements from developers towards the cost of infrastructure and replace this with a new Infrastructure Levy which is set by Central Government.
- Penalise Local Authorities who fail to determine applications within Statutory time limits.
- Increase the threshold on Affordable Housing for small sites from 10 to up to 50 homes.

The impact:

- Less democracy in local decision making. At present, South Somerset District Council receives thousands of contributions on Planning from local residents and communities.
- Playing fast and loose with the planet. Given our declared Climate and Ecological Emergency, which calls for radical action to reduce the impact of human behaviours on our planet, the proposal to make environmental impact assessments "quicker and simpler" is at odds with the need to make meaningful and sustainable change.
- Jeopardising investment in our communities. Since 2010, South Somerset District Council has raised more than £9m from developers in Section 106 contributions which have supported the building of community assets such as swimming pools, play parks and village halls. In my own Ward of Hamdon, s106 has brought in more than £150,000 in the last three years, delivering a well loved adventure playpark, and improvements to village halls and environment.
- These have gone directly to local communities. S106 has also helped to deliver a gross contribution of more than 2,600 affordable homes in South Somerset since 2006, and 49% of all affordable homes nationally. The proposal to replace this with an Infrastructure Levy, set by Central Government could risks halting the investment in our communities which we have been successful in delivering.
- Threatening to sanction Councils for failing to deliver a new Local Plan in a mere 30 months.
- Up to a 20% reduction in the number of Affordable Homes by the Government's own estimates
