## Standard Conditions for Community Grants (over £750)

- 1. The funding has been awarded based on the information provided on the application form.
- 2. The SSDC Evaluation Form is completed in full and returned when the applicant returns the signed acceptance of the funding offer.
- 3. All other funding sources are secured.
- 4. SSDC is given prior notice of the date when work is to commence.
- 5. SSDC is acknowledged on any publicity and on any permanent acknowledgement of assistance towards the project.
- 6. The applicant will work, in conjunction with SSDC Officers, to monitor the success of the scheme and the benefits to the community, resulting from SSDC's contribution to the project.
- 7. Should the scheme be delayed or unable to commence within six months from the date of this Committee, SSDC must be notified in writing.
- 8. Should the final cost be less than the estimate considered by the Committee, the funding will be proportionately reduced. However, if the cost exceeds that estimate, no further funding will normally be available.
- 9. The applicant demonstrates an appropriate Parish Council contribution.

## Special Conditions for the award of grants to community play areas.

- 1) Applicants must make provision for the future maintenance and replacement of the facilities. SSDC recommends the applicant set up a sinking fund to achieve this condition.
- 2) Applicants must use a contractor from the approved list of contractors.
- 3) All new items of play equipment and impact-absorbing surfacing to comply with European Standard EN 1176 and EN 1177.
- 4) Play area designs must be approved in writing by an SSDC Play and Youth Facilities Officer prior to submitting the application and placing orders for equipment or ancillary items.
- 5) SSDC must be notified of, and approve, any proposed changes to the project.
- 6) On completion of the construction work, the applicant must commission SSDC to carry out a Post Installation Inspection of the play area and pay SSDC's fees in connection with the inspection.
- 7) Applicants must continue to maintain the play area in accordance with BN1176 and the play equipment manufacturer's instructions.
- 8) Applicants must display a sign at the entrance to the play area that conforms to the guidance set out in EN 1176.
