Purpose of the Report

To provide a summary report on community grants awarded to projects and organisations in Area North between 1 April 2008 and 31 March 2009, allocated from the SSDC Area North Committee annual grants budget and capital programme.

Recommendation(s)

It is recommended that members note the contents of the report.

Background

South Somerset District Council provides significant financial support each year in the form of grants to community organisations, town or parish councils or local partnerships, to support a wide variety of local priorities, usually led by or involving volunteers.

Each Area Committee receives an annual allocation from the Council's annual budget, as agreed by the District Executive. During 2008-09 this was £31,240. Grants are awarded either by decisions made by the Area Committee, or for applications of £750 or less by the Head of Area Development (North) in conjunction with ward members (or the Chairman for area wide grants) under the SSDC scheme of delegation.

In addition grants can be awarded from the Area Capital Programme, or submitted into the Corporate Capital Programme.

Community grants are assessed against a set of corporate grants policies, using a consistent scoring system. SSDC agrees corporate priorities for grants each year, and these are used together with Area priorities.

The budget for Area North Community Grants is 2009-10 is £29,360.

Area North Community Grants 2008-09

A list of all community grants awarded in 2008-09 is contained in **Appendix A**. Further details on each application are available if requested.

A total of £67,491 was awarded in grants during 2008-09. This included the full allocation of the annual grants budget, together with £36,251 from the Area North Capital Programme.

A majority of the projects supported have been completed (see **appendix A**). The unfinished projects will continue to receive support if required, and are regularly monitored.

Support to assist projects to be successful; including advice for additional sources of funding, project design, consultation, planning and consents, and many other issues comes from a wide variety of SSDC service teams and other organisations. These include: Sports, Arts and Leisure, Countryside, Heritage and Tourism, Planning and Building Control, Engineering and Property Services, the Community Council for Somerset, the Somerset Rural Youth Project and Somerset County Council.

Observations/comments

- Officer time. Whilst the awarding of a grant is tangible, less easily quantifiable is the amount of officer time spent on each application. The application from South Petherton Bridge Club, for example, resulted in a delegated grant of £150, but the Community Development Officer was able to offer funding advice leading to the group's successful receipt of an additional £750 from other sources. The approximate cost of administration of grants was.
- Working with partners. Grants have been awarded in conjunction with other SSDC services, eg the money to assist with rugby coaching sessions in Martock were part of a larger programme delivered through Sports Art & Leisure. Similarly, SSDC's Arts Development Officer, in conjunction with partner agencies, sourced funding for the Golden Oldies singing project with Area North contributing £500 towards the total start-up cost of £10,000.
- Long term benefits Some projects that receive community grants are quick to deliver their benefits, others take longer. The long term outcomes of each scheme are important to consider when making an award, though the effects of some will be further reaching than others. Projects do not need to be large in order to have a long term effect eg £175 towards the £350 needed by Long Load Village Hall enabled the provision of a handrail at the entrance which will greatly assist those accessing the facility for many years
