6. **Progress Report on the Frontline Councillors Grant Scheme**

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Purpose of the Report

To update members on the Frontline Councillors Grant Scheme pilot project. This is the second quarterly progress report required to be made to Area Committees by Full Council for members' information.

Recommendation

It is recommended that members note the report.

Background

Members, officers and communities have worked together to build the successful Area Working model that we currently enjoy. Specific work was carried out during 2006 by Area Chairmen, Heads of Area Development and others to further improve the Area Working model, especially in relation to community engagement and delivery of services to local communities.

As part of this work the Frontline Councillors Grant Scheme was developed. The decision was made at the Full Council meeting in December 2006 (with further amendments at the Full Council meeting in July 2007) to provide each individual member with a budget of £2,500 to support local community initiatives/projects in harmony with the council's priorities. Guidance has been issued to all members.

This first pilot year will close on 31st March 2008. See Financial Implications section for 2008/09 budget proposals.

Grants Awarded from July 2007 to January 2008

The previous (first) report covered the period from July to October 2007. The scheme was just coming into use and only 6 grants had been awarded to the end of October. By 7th February 2008 however, activity has increased substantially and 55 grants have been awarded. These include examples where several Councillors have jointly supported projects. A wide variety of community activity is being supported.

Financial Implications

The future of the scheme is subject to review. The 2007/08 budget is funded 50% revenue and 50% capital. There is no revenue provision for 2008/09, but continuance of the capital provision was agreed at District Executive on 7th February 2008. A review of the scheme will take place in April/May 2008.
