

### Notice of Consultation – Review of BT Pay phone provision in Area West Parishes

South Somerset District Council recently received a notice from BT advising us of a review of pay phone provision across South Somerset. We have become aware that parishes have not been informed directly, and BT is expecting the local authority to provide any feedback to BT on local views.

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with the information we have received, and to suggest that you provide any views / comments you wish make, back to SSDC, and in turn we will forward this on to BT.

The attached note sets out the information from BT, together with a list of affected parishes in Area West. You will see that BT have requested that local authorities act as a single point of contact. The deadline to reply direct to BT is 2<sup>nd</sup> July.

# Information from BT – Proposal to re-align payphone provision to meet consumer demand.

As part of BT's Universal Service Obligation it is required to provide adequate coverage of public payphones. In recent years the needs of consumers have changed drastically with the increase in mobile phone ownership leading to a complete change in the communications culture throughout the UK - the number of calls made from BT payphones has more than halved in the last three years. Ninety nine per cent of UK homes now have a phone at home and 85 per cent have a mobile phone. There are currently 61,792 public payphones in Great Britain and 60% of these no longer cover their costs.

Striking a balance between the growing commercial pressures and providing an effective payphone service is vital, and BT has managed to keep its payphone business viable by careful management of costs. However, this challenge is becoming ever more demanding, so BT constantly needs to review payphone usage and on occasions looks to re-align the public payphone provision more closely to the reducing demand that still exists.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> March 2006 the Office of Communications (Ofcom) published a statement following their 2005 review of universal service in the Telecommunications market. Part of that statement (which can be viewed at:

<u>www.ofcom.org.uk/consult.condocs.uso/uso\_statement/</u>) amended BT's obligations with regard to the removal of payphone service.

In compliance with those revised obligations BT has now written to South Somerset District Council as part of a formal consultation process regarding BT's current programme of proposed public payphone removals.

BT are consulting out of courtesy only and are advising that there are a number of these payphones within Area West which they will be addressing over the forthcoming months. There are currently 15 public payphones within Area West, which are little used by consumers and are therefore proposed by BT for removal under full consultation. Details of these boxes affected in Area West are shown on the enclosed sheets, which include telephone number and address on a box by box basis.

BT will also place consultation notices in the relevant kiosks to ensure that the local community are fully informed.
