5. Amendments to Constitution

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Purpose of the Report

The purpose of this report is to ensure that all amendments to the Council's Constitution agreed over the past 6 months are accurately reflected in the Constitution document. The full Council has to approve the Constitution, and any amendments to it, following consideration by the Audit Committee.

Recommendation

It is recommended that members of the Audit Committee note the amendments set out in the table on pages 2-4 of this report and recommend approval by Full Council at its 17th July 2008 meeting, subject to any comments Audit Committee members may wish to make.

Background

The Council's Constitution is continually monitored and revised to make sure that the Council's decision-making processes are operating effectively and are in line with legislative requirements and best practice. The Constitution sets out how Council operates, how decisions are made and includes procedures to ensure that the Council's decisions are efficient, transparent and accountable.

Over the past 6 months, Council has approved several changes to the Constitution and these approved amendments must now be incorporated into the Constitution. There have also been changes in government legislation that require amendments to certain elements of the Constitution, details of which are contained in this report. The report also contains changes to both Member and Officer Schemes of Delegation that need to be reflected in the Constitution.

As members will be aware, the Council's Corporate Plan is currently being refreshed. This process may well necessitate further changes to the Constitution and if this is the case, a further report will be submitted to members in due course.
